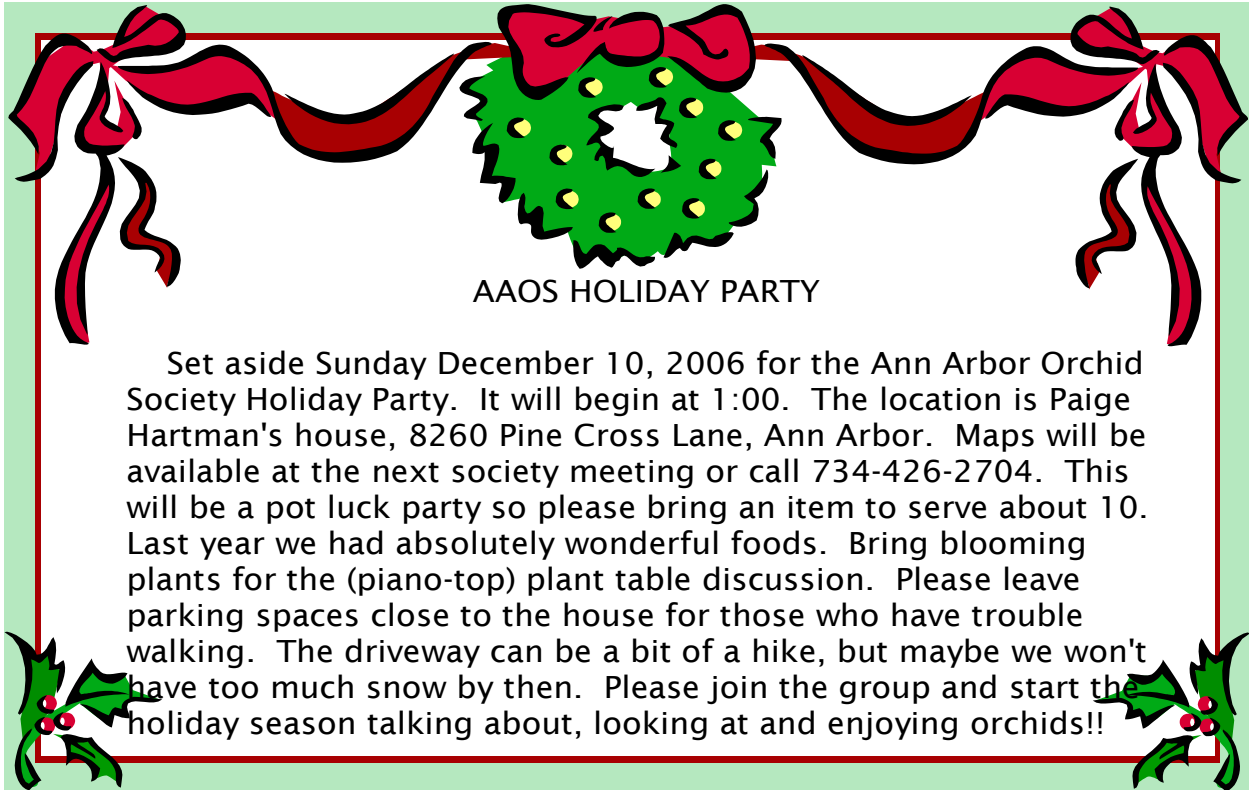

AAOS Study Group

The AAOS Study Group met for the first time October 8th at Susan Haddock's home. Eight members attended. We began our discussion with the Bulbophyllums, Draculas and other orchids Susan had hanging on her front porch. Susan has built a very interesting circular stand that holds all the mounted plants. She has plenty of tree shade to protect the plants, and they are easy to water with the garden hose.

Inside, Susan uses each window and windowsill available. Her dining area faces southeast which gives her great light for all sorts of orchids. She has great variety of species. Growing and blooming in this window are Vandas, Phragmipediums and Phalaenopsis. A bedroom with less heat and south west windows is the home of Pleurothallids and Masdevallias. A sewing room has Paphiopedilums and a family room has Phalaenopsis.



Our discussion time centered on Bulbophyllums. Susan has a beautiful Cirr. Elizabeth Ann 'Buckelberry' in bloom. She also prepared an information sheet on the species and we discussed a book about Bulbophyllums.

The second Study Group meeting will be Nov. 10, 3:00 at Riki Marquis's home. Discussion will be "The best advice you ever heard about growing orchids."
